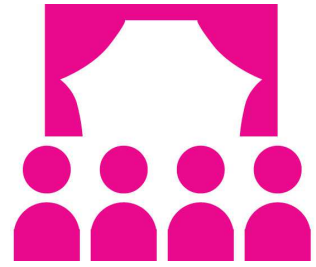


PERFORMANCE

1000 Lovers, an extraordinary site-responsive mobile performance tracing a broken pathway from the sea to the city, by MAP [Brown/Hannah/Scoones] with the support of Arts Alive.
