# **BINGRAPHIES**

#### MITCH TAWHI THOMAS

Mitch Tawhi Thomas was born in Taranaki and spent his childhood in Stratford. His whanau hail from Ngati Maniapoto and the Hutt Valley. In 2002 Mitch received the Bruce Mason Award and in 2012 he received the Adam NZ Play Award for *Hui.* 

#### RACHEL HOUSE

Ngai Tahu and Ngati Mutunga

Rachel House is an award winning theatre performer and director with an increasing profile in film. She has been involved in films such as *Boy, Eagle vs Shark* and *Whale Rider* and has played pivotal roles in the premiere of some of New Zealand classic theatre such as *Woman Far Walking*. In 2012 she directed te reo Māori version of Shakespeare's *Troilus and Cressida* which played to critical acclaim at the Globe Theatre in London.

#### **SEAN COYLE**

Sean has been a theatre designer and arts educator for the past 20 years. He initially trained at Toi Whakaari and has since completed a Graduate Diploma in Theatre Design from the Victorian College of the Arts Melbourne and a Masters in Art and Design from AUT. Some design credits include Have Car Will Trave/for Taki Rua Theatre and Shopping and F\*\*\*ing and The Mercy Seat for Silo Theatre.

#### JENNIFER LAL

Jennifer is a five time recipient of the Chapman Tripp Lighting Designer of the Year award — including Mitch's Have Car Will Travel. She worked on Atamira a theatre/television collaboration with five Māori theatre scripts being broadcast on MTS. Most recently she has been around the country designing Englightenment for Centrepoint Theatre, In the Next Room for the Fortune Theatre, the sold out Beatgirls Spector at Circa, the critically acclaimed The Pride for Silo Theatre and recently Into the Uncanny Valley the last STAB show at the old BATS. She has had the privilege of lighting most of Mitch's plays.

#### EMMA RANSLEY

Emma Ransley is an Auckland-based costume designer who graduated in 2009 from Massey University and Toi Whakaari:NZ Drama School. During and after university, Emma has worked with many of New Zealand's top designers on film and television projects.

#### LEON RADOJKOVIC

Nga Puhi

Leon Radojkovic is an Auckland-based musician and composer. He plays in bands and writes music for film, theatre and for fun. He is the creator of LIVE LIVE CINEMA: Carnival of Souls which has toured

Aotearoa, Australia and recently made its European debut. He was also the Musical Director/Piano Smasher for Silo's 2012 production *BREL*.

#### **CAMERON RHODES**

Cameron is a graduate of Toi Whakaari NZ Drama School, and is of Ngai Tahu descent. He has appeared in over 80 productions, including Carnival of Souls for the Auckland Arts Festival, which last year toured to Sydney, Perth and Frankfurt. Silo shows include Tartuffe and Assassins, ATC includes Mary Stuart and She Stoops To Conquer: TV: Agent Anna, The Banker, The Escorts and The \$18 Million. Film: Romeo and Juliet A Love Song, Mr Pip, Housebound. Recent directing work: Elevator for the Auckland Fringe and Where Are You My Only One at The Basement. Cameron is on the board of NZ Actor's Equity and The Actors Program.

#### STEPHEN BUTTERWORTH

Ngati Porou

Stephen graduated from Toi Whakaari in 1994. He has been working as an professional actor/performer for more than 25 years. It has taken him from Australia to Japan and Hawaii with shows like *Waiora, West Side Story* and *Brain dead - the musical.*
